ANNE WHYTE'S areas of work are international development, especially environmental assessment and management, and science and technology policy. Within these fields she has done research on environmental risk assessment and public perception, community participation and the role of information and communication technology in development. For the past ten years she has led many evaluation and strategic planning projects in international development. She is trained in the natural sciences (geomorphology) and the social sciences (human geography, anthropology and psychology). She received a BA and MA from the University of Cambridge, England and a Ph.D. in Geography and Environmental Engineering in 1971 from the Johns Hopkins University, USA. Anne Whyte is President of Mestor Associates, a Canadian consulting company specializing in international development, environmental policy and organizational management and innovation. Formerly she was Director General for Natural Resources and Environment at the International Development Research Centre (IDRC) Canada (1986-96) and was the Director of the Environmental Studies Programme at the University of Toronto (1976-86). In 1987 she was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada and of the World Academy of Arts and Sciences and to membership of Sigma Xi. Anne Whyte has been active for many years in the international science and development communities, serving on more than 20 international Boards and Committees since 1990. She was Co-Chair of the UN Millennium Ecosystem Assessment Review Board. She has been a Member and Vice-Chair of the International Scientific Committee for IHDP (1996-2002) and a member of the START Scientific Committee (1996-2001), the Advisory Committee for Environment (ACE) for ICSU (1992-1995) and a member of CSPR since 2006.
